Tribal Affairs: What We Do


- Coordinate tribal public health activities across HRSA
- Serve as HRSA's primary point of contact for tribal governments and tribal organizations and HRSA liaison to and representative on tribal health related committees and working groups
- Coordinate with HRSA Bureaus and Offices to leverage resources or develop initiatives to support tribal health resources and services
- Coordinate, support, and convene the HRSA Tribal Advisory Council

HRSA IEA Addresses HRSA Priorities - Behavioral Health

- HRSA IEA advances evidence-based and promising behavioral health practices through outreach, surveillance, convening, partnerships, and technical assistance.
- Behavioral Health activities centered around regional priorities include:
 - Collaborations to address SUD/opioids and suicide, pediatric and maternal behavioral health, workforce, rural behavioral health, and tribal behavioral health
 - Engagement with state behavioral health leadership and key stakeholders
 - Health Centers and other HRSA-supported entities

Purpose:

To recognize issues and trends regarding the Health Workforce, support stakeholder collaborations, and provide recommendations to help HRSA focus policies and programs.

HRSA IEA Address HRSA Priorities – Maternal Health

HRSA IEA supports the White House Blueprint for Addressing the Maternal Health Crisis, HHS Maternal Health Action Plan, and the Surgeon General's Call to Action to Improve Maternal Health.



Connect with Regional Staff, cont.




When might HRSA IEA reach out to you?


