COMADRE PROGRAM

The Comadre Program, is a support group whereby ex and current transitional clients get together to discuss issues and solutions. This program also gives De Colores staff the opportunity to follow up on its former participants.

AHIJADO PROGRAM

A program for the children who are currently residing at De Colores. The program provides individual and group sessions, advocacy for eye lenses, medical care, clothing and other needs.

De Colores also provides field trips and special events.

De Colores History

Since 1983,CPLC addressed their awareness of the critical need for comprehensive domestic violence programs in the Latino community by, incorporating the De Colores Domestic Violence Shelter. In 1986, there were only 17 beds and the house that sheltered the program was located in a flood district. These circumstances prompted CPLC to relocate the shelter.

De Colores has evolved into one of Arizona's best known and most respected shelters for victims of domestic violence. De Colores is recognized in Arizona for being culturally sensitive and aware. De Colores offers both crisis and transitional shelter, free of charge. There are 24 beds, 16 on-site transitional beds, and 24 off-site transitional beds.

The crisis program allows a woman and her children to stay at the shelter and receive services for 45 to 90 days. The women and their children are provided with food, shelter, clothing, counseling, and other necessities free of charge.

The transitional program offers crisis residents the opportunity to participate in an 18-month program that allows them the needed time to become self-sufficient. Participation in the transitional program depends on the client's needs, bed space, and their desire to become self-sufficient.
