## The Road to Independent Practice

- 2010: Governor Bill Ritter "opts out" of Medicare rule requiring physician supervision of CRNAs in rural hospitals.
- 2010-2014: Litigation continues through Colorado courts.
- 2015: Colorado Supreme Court upholds "opt out"
  - Board of Nursing endorses decision.
  - APRNs become "independent providers"





#### Meanwhile...

- 2010: Statutory changes limiting NP Prescriptive Practice
  - Statute required 3600 supervised hours for prescriptive authority
  - MD/DO only could serve as mentors for the process
- 2014: NPATCH recommendations to change statute
  - Governor-appointed Task force of MDs, APRN, Community Reps
- 2015: Colorado Legislature passes new statute:
  - 2015 statute reduced to mentorship to1000 hours (**v** to 750 in 2023)
  - Mentor could be either MD/DO or NP with RXN





### What Did NPATCH Accomplish?

Prescriptive Authority Pre-2015	Prescriptive Authority 2015-Present
Degree completion Certification APRN Registry RXN-P (3600 Total Hours) RXN (Full Authority)	Degree Completion Certification APRN Registry RXN-P (1000 Total Hours; now reduced to 750 Hours) RXN (Full Authority
Preceptors/Mentors were MD or DO only	Preceptors/Mentors now can be MD, DO, or NPs with Full RXN and same population focus
