Note: Four of the fifteen questions (numbers 7, 11, 13 and 14) are designed to be state-specific. You should either determine the correct answers or remove these questions before playing the MCH Trivia game.

Why is a metabolic screen collected on all newborns?	It is collected to find rare, but serious birth disorders that can cause brain damage.
For what does the acronym FASD stand?	Fetal alcohol spectrum disorders
What is the most frequently reported type of birth defect?	Heart defects
What percentage of U.S. pregnancies in 2001 were unintended?	49% (From Finer 2006 article in <i>Perspectives on Sexual and Reproductive Health</i> , Vol. 34, No. 4, pp. 14-17)
When was Title V created?	1935
What percentage of high school students nationally reported being hit, slapped or physically hurt on purpose by their boyfriend or girlfriend in 2007?	9.9% ( <a href="http://www.cdc.gov/ViolencePrevention/intimatepartnerviolence/teen_c">http://www.cdc.gov/ViolencePrevention/intimatepartnerviolence/teen_c</a> )

What is a common cause of infant mortality that is mostly preventable?	<b>Accidental suffocation in a sleep environment</b> "Most infant deaths during sleep used to be called Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS) and were considered to be an unknown cause that was largely unpreventable. However, improvements in infant care and large population-based epidemiologic research has shown that many infant deaths are preventable, such as suffocation from pillows, heavy blankets, or other objects, or because the infant's face is pressed against the parent's stomach."
When did the WIC Program begin?	1972 Established by Congress in September 1972. Made permanent in 1975.
How much does [Your State Title V Program] pay out to medical providers each year?	\$____
What does the IDEA do?	The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), enacted by Congress in 1975, requires all states and public agencies provide early intervention, special education, and other services to all children with disabilities in the United States. One of the key provisions of the act is that public schools create Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) that specify the special services and modifications to optimize the education of each eligible student with a disability.

How many years has [Your State] been collecting PRAMS data?	____ Years
What is the "Title X Program"?	Enacted by Congress in 1970 as Title X of the Public Health Services Act, the mission of Title X is to provide individuals the information and means to exercise personal choice in the spacing of their children, with priority for services given to low income individuals. Title X programs provide low cost, high-quality education, counseling, and clinical family planning health services.
