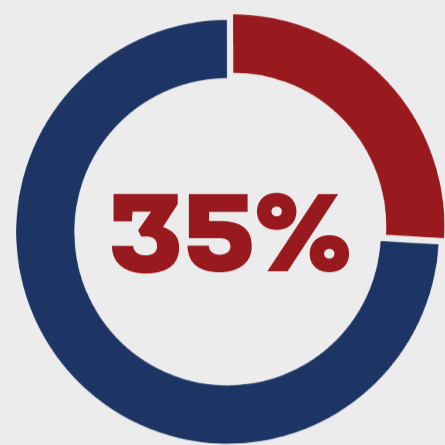

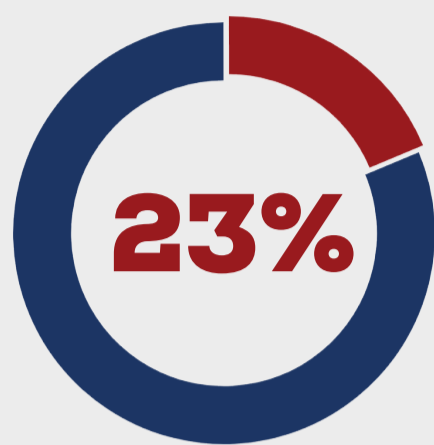
IN FY2016:

Primary Health Care

HIV/AIDS



IN FY2016:

MORE THAN 551,000 people received at least one Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program-funded service

85% of Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program clients receiving HIV medical care were virally suppressed

Poison Help



Poison control center (PCC) consultations with Medicare beneficiaries resulted in a **REDUCTION OF MORE THAN 15,000 HOSPITAL DAYS** and **COST SAVINGS OF \$16 MILLION ANNUALLY**

Transplantation



MORE THAN 138 MILLION PEOPLE are registered to be organ donors—an all-time high



MORE THAN 16 MILLION PEOPLE are registered blood stem cell donors

SAVED PATIENTS **NEARLY 1.6 MILLION MILES IN TRAVEL**, by providing primary and specialty care closer to home using telehealth technology
