Engaging Other Physician Groups

International Medical Graduates

 Loosen visa location restrictions and allow IMGs to travel to areas of need to practice or engage in telemedicine.

Retired physicians

 Temporarily allow physicians to come out of retirement and practice during COVID-19 and provide the necessary liability coverage.

Out of state physicians

 Allow physicians to cross state lines to practice where they are most needed.



Upcoming Legislation

- Rural America Health Corps Act
 (S.2406): The goal of this bill is to address
 workforce shortages in rural communities.
 This bill would expand the National Health
 Service Corps and create a 5-year loan
 forgiveness model to enhance physician
 retention in rural communities.
- Health Heroes 2020 Act: This bill would expand the National Health Service Corps by increasing funding to the program and establishing a Reserve Corps option to help maintain surge capacity in response to public health emergencies.



3rd Package GME successes

Deferred student loan payments and interest until September 30, 2020.

 Use of Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants for emergency aid to struggling students.

 The continuation of Federal Work-Study payments during a qualifying emergency.

• States can use Child Care and Development Block Grant funds to provide childcare assistance to health care sector employees.

4th Package GME asks

- At least \$20,000 of federal student loan forgiveness or \$20,000 of tuition relief for residents and medical students that aid in the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Cap flexibility in CMS GME reimbursement to hospitals to accommodate variations in training due to the COVID-19 response.
