Thank you for preparing the report on *Newborn Screening for Severe Combined Immunodeficiency (SCID)*, which I had requested. The report provides helpful information on current state and federal efforts to address the recommendation of the Secretary's Advisory Committee on Newborns and Children (SACHDNC) to add SCID to the Recommended Uniform Screening Panel.

The collaboration among the Department of Health and Human Services' agencies to facilitate state and territory implementation of newborn screening for SCID, as well as the partnership demonstrated among state and territory public health newborn screening programs, has been influential in furthering improvement and expansion of screening for this life-threatening disorder.
