Thank you for your letter on behalf of the Secretary's Advisory Committee on Infant Mortality (SACIM) providing greater detail on how to operationalize the first strategic direction—improving the health of women before, during, and beyond pregnancy—from your January 2013 report *Recommendations for Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) Action and Framework for a National Strategy*.

By identifying four core recommendations for this strategy, along with six related actions for consideration, it is clear that SACIM is building on the efforts of the Administration to improve women's health through implementation of the Affordable Care Act. Addressing health disparities, particularly in infants and women, is a priority for the Department, and the Affordable Care Act will provide our country with many opportunities to refocus efforts on these very important issues.
