FY25 President's Budget: Maternal and Child Health Bureau

- Additional FY25 requests:
 - +\$27 million for Healthy Start to support training and staffing of Peer Navigators
 - \$565.8 million, an increase of \$65.8 million for the Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting program
 - Extension and expansion of mandatory funding for Family-to-Family Health Information Centers Program to \$12 million – an increase of \$6.3 million
 - 5-year extension of the authorization for the Autism and Other
 Developmental Disabilities programs, which sunsets at the end of FY 2024





FY25 President's Budget: Maternal and Child Health Bureau

FY 2025 Budget requests \$1.8 billion, an increase of \$135.7 million to improve maternal and child health:

- +\$15 million for the Alliance for Innovation on Maternal Health to build obstetric safety-net capacity in maternity care deserts
- +\$6 million for State Maternal Health Innovation awards
- +\$5 million for community-based Social Determinants of Maternal Health initiatives
- +\$5 million for growing and diversifying the doula workforce
- +\$5.5 million for Screening and Treatment for Maternal Mental Health and Substance Use Disorders Program



 - Supporting maternal mental health



Congenital Syphilis

- Congenital syphilis in the U.S. has increased more than 10-fold since 2012
- About 90% of cases are preventable with timely testing and treatment
- In almost 40% of cases, mothers received no prenatal care during pregnancy





Congenital Syphilis- How You Can Help

- Partner and collaborate with organizations that provide care to pregnant women
- Share the importance of:
 - Screenings before pregnancy, first prenatal visit, 3rd trimester, and delivery (depending on county rates)
 - Timely treatment for positive cases
- Visit CDC site to see if your county is above the Healthy People 2030 target (4.6 per 100,000 women)
