

- Provide total information for each clients referrals, education







- Use client-based information along with data to develop programs that help them and allow area health care providers and agencies to SEE the clients and their desire to be the best they can be for themselves and the infant/infantto-be
- Work with area leader to explain why reducing infant mortality and maternal mortality are beneficial to them now and in the long term


