

Guilford County ICO4MCH's Preconception Peer Educator (PPE) Program Model

Perinatal Health Team



The PPE program is housed under the Spartan Well-Being (SWB) and Spartan Recovery Program (SRP). Each unit employs a small number of student workers to provide health education programs to students on campus. SWB programs focus on general health and wellness related programs- dimensions of wellness, sexual health, sleep, diet and nutrition, and violence prevention. SRP programs focus on maintaining recovery and harm reduction with substance use. The PPE student workers interweave PPE content into the programs and services offered through each department.

The PPE program is housed under the Alvin V. Blount Jr. Student Health Center. Within the Health Center is a program called Healthy Brothers Healthy Sisters (HBHS). This group consists of about 60 student-employees, and they develop unique programs to address health disparities within various communities aiming to reduce barriers to care while offering an educational component. Within this group are 7 different auxiliaries/focus areas, PPE has become one of the 7 that students develop programs for. Fifteen students were selected to participate in this auxiliary based on their interests while applying for employment.

Guilford County ICO4MCH's Preconception Peer Educator (PPE) Program Model 2



Students participating in the PPE program are required to complete the PPE trainings in its entirety. Preconception Peer Educators have participated in 12 hours' of training spread amongst 3-4 days. Student-employees were tasked to develop programs to host throughout the year based on the Preconception Peer Educator Program material they learned in the training. Constant communication is kept between advisors and PPE students by holding weekly or bi-weekly meetings to discuss updates and requirements. Throughout the planning process and program implementation students document their role in the program and submit an activity log at the conclusion of events. Quarterly reports are submitted to EBG.


