Background

- 2008: The NC Division of Public Health-Women's Health Branch (now known as the Women, Infant and Community Wellness Section) partnered with the Office of Minority Health-Health Resource Center (OMH-HRC) to launch an inaugural "A Healthy Baby Begins with You" event in Eastern North Carolina
- 2010: Sponsored first Preconception Peer Education Training (PPE)
- This initiative links back to North Carolina's Perinatal Health Strategic Plan (https://wicws.dph.ncdhhs.gov/phsp/phsp.htm)
 - Goal 3-Improve Health Care for All People of Reproductive Age
 - Point 11: Increase access to preconception, reproductive and sexual health care


Preconception Peer Educator (PPE) Program Overview

- **Goal:** to improve preconception health among persons of reproductive age and improve future pregnancy, birth and infant health outcomes
- Priority Audience: high school and college students and community members of reproductive age

Components:

- Site, advisor and peer educator recruitment
- 12-16 hours of training-includes pre/posts, content and activities focused on preconception and reproductive health and wellness, health equity and related content shared by subject matter experts,
 PPE workplan development and PPE activities conducted on campus and in communities at large
