- **Vaccine Safety**

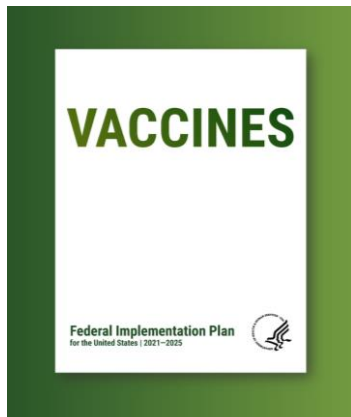
- ✓ Develop a vaccine safety report which includes the following:
 - Recommendations to address current and emerging vaccine safety challenges
 - Minimize preventable vaccine-related adverse events
 - Improve all the individual components needed for a robust safety system
 - Enhance coordination and stakeholder input into the timely detection and assessment of vaccine safety signals

- Accompanies and aligns with **Vaccines National Strategic Plan** and has the same goals, objectives, and strategies
- Outlines the roles of Federal departments and agencies and their specific contributions to achieving vaccine goals

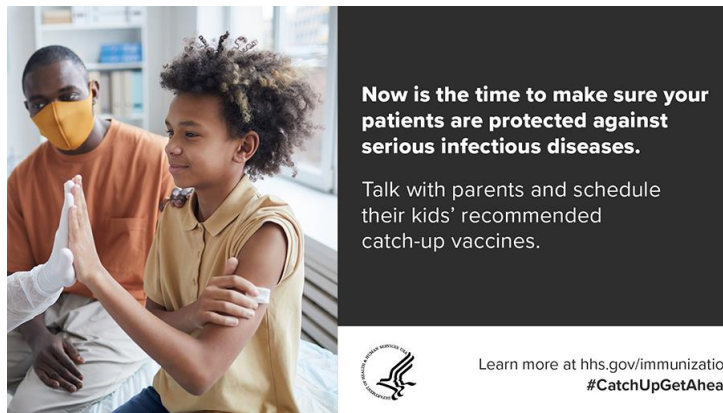
Adult Immunization: The Path Forward

- The NAIIS: A coalition of 130 organizations and 700 immunization professionals, dedicated to improving vaccine uptake.
- Annual face-to-face meeting resumed at the 2022 National Adult and Influenza Immunization Summit (NAIIS) November 2–3, 2022 in Atlanta.
- Next annual meeting: May 9 to 11, 2023 in Atlanta. Registration still open at izsummitpartners.org
- Summit themes include:
 - ✓ Improving data gathering and access
 - ✓ New adult vaccine recommendations and implementation strategies
 - ✓ New vaccines and monoclonals
 - ✓ Updates on Influenza; COVID-19; and Monkeypox
 - ✓ Celebrating COVID-19 successes

- [HPV VAX NOW Young Adult Outreach Toolkit](#) provides messages and graphics to help encourage young adults get the HPV vaccine now. February is National Cancer Prevention Month, so messages emphasized that young adults who haven't been vaccinated still need to get the vaccine to protect against HPV-related cancers.
- [Catch-Up to Get Ahead Toolkit](#) provides messages and graphics to help spread awareness about catch up immunizations. These materials can be used to promote vaccination for all audiences.



Other Strategic Partnerships

- Healthy People 2030 webinar March 21, 2023. Explore three objectives
 - Increase the proportion of persons who are vaccinated annually against flu
 - Increase the proportion of pregnant women who receive early and adequate prenatal care
 - Reduced congenital syphilis
- Identifying “best practices” for COVID-19 testing and vaccination; also includes “best practices” for routine immunizations
