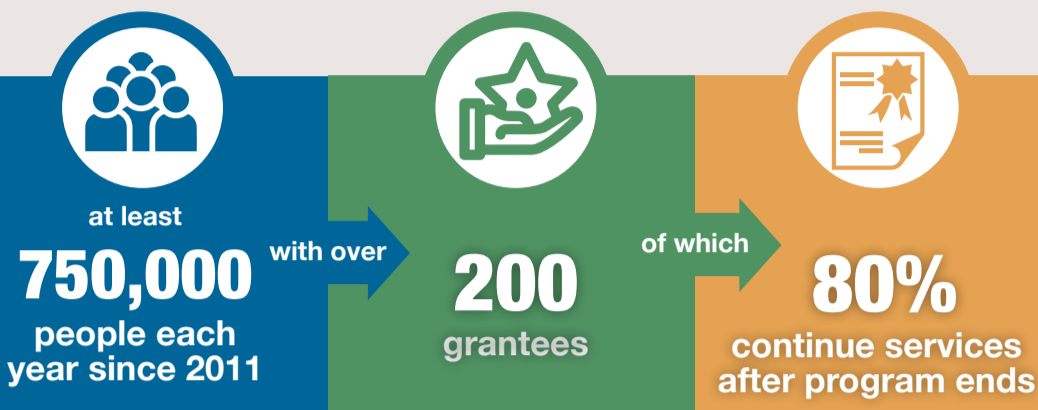

The goal of rural community programs is to improve health service delivery by strengthening health networks and encourage collaboration among rural health care providers.



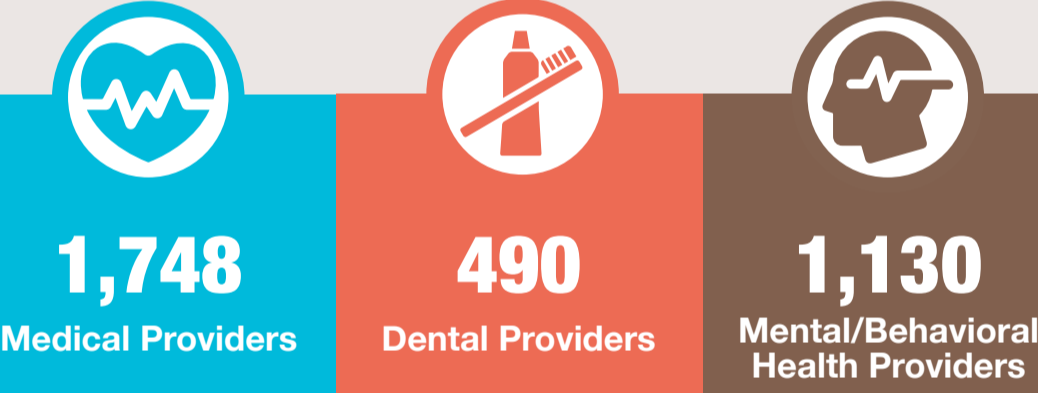
Health Center Program

Of the **more than 10,900** National Health Service Corps (NHSC) providers in FY18, **3,368** worked in rural areas:



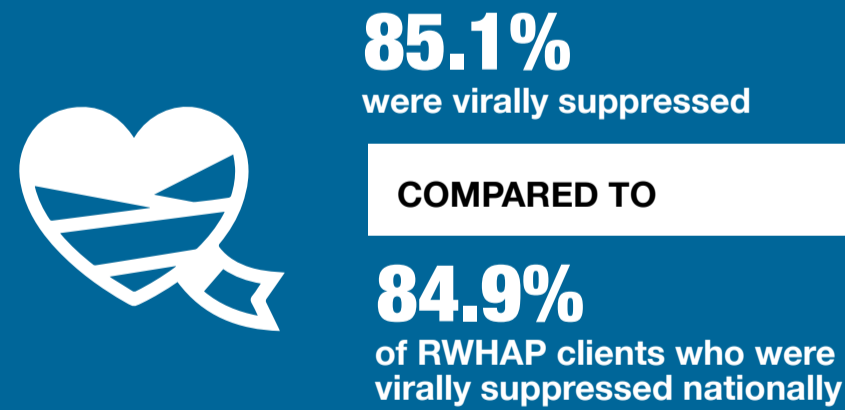
Of the **1,865** NURSE Corps members in FY18:



Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program

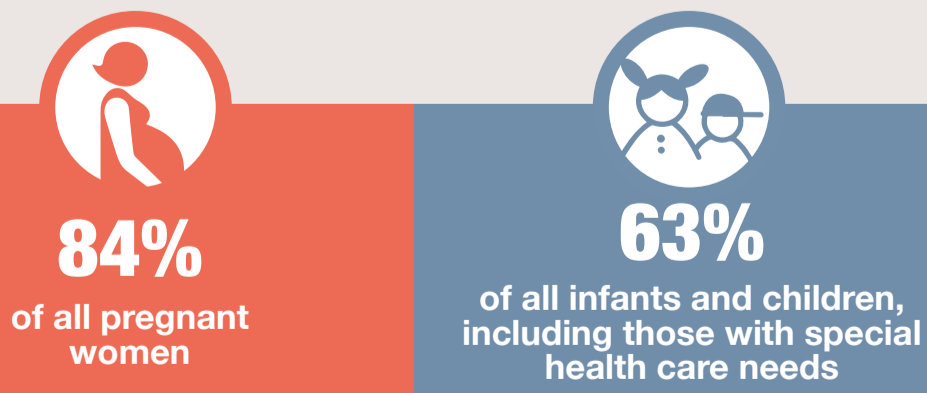
In 2016, there were **12,706** RWHAP clients who visited only rural service providers.

Maternal & Child Health

In 2016, the Maternal and Child Health Block Grant Program served or benefited **more than 61 million** pregnant women and children in the U.S. This figure encompasses:



Reaching more communities than ever before, the Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) Program has **DOUBLED** the total number of counties served since the program began. In FY17, the MIECHV Program funded services in **22%** of all rural counties.
