The Federal Office of Rural Health Policy (FORHP) has supported:

Health Center Program

More than **30 million** people – **1 in 11** people nationwide – rely on HRSA-funded health centers for care, including:



Health Workforce

The National Health Service Corps (NHSC) grew to **more than 16,200** providers in FY20 with **5,600+** serving in rural areas.




With two new loan repayment programs, a total of **2,885** NHSC providers are working to combat the opioid crisis in treatment facilities nationwide, with **645** of them providing care in rural communities.

Of the **1,843** Nurse Corps members in FY20:




Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program

In 2018, there were **10,996** RWHAP clients who visited only rural providers. Of these RWHAP clients (with available viral load data):




Maternal & Child Health

In FY18, the Maternal and Child Health Block Grant Program funded 59 states and jurisdictions to provide health care and public health services to reach an estimated **55 million** people, including:



Included in the over **47 million** children served, Title V supported direct and/or enabling services for **1.6 million** children with special health care needs.

Reaching more communities than ever before, the Maternal, and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) Program has **DOUBLED** the total number of counties served since the program began. In FY19, the MIECHV Program funded services in **25%** of all rural counties.
