

## FY2023 HRSA's Rural Health Grants

## **New Hampshire Fact Sheet | November 2023**

The Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) – through the Federal Office of Rural Health Policy (FORHP) – provided approximately \$4.7 million in funding to the state of New Hampshire to increase health care access, strengthen health networks, and focus on care quality improvements for Critical Access Hospitals and small rural hospitals. FORHP is also supporting HRSA's goal to achieve health equity by supporting efforts to strengthen health care delivery systems, and reduce the morbidity and mortality associated with substance use disorder.

By increasing access to quality services and training a more skilled health workforce, these investments from FORHP have allowed communities in New Hampshire and across the country to improve health outcomes and address health disparities.
